



Jon and Nicolás Uriarte, awarded "Clarín" prizes for sport

After an extraordinary year reaching the semifinals with Argentina in the World Youth Volleyball Championship in Mexico, Nicolás Uriarte's sports career was boosted by the Newcomer's Prize from the Argentinean newspaper "Clarín" which declared him the "best play-maker in the world."

These awards, where the newspaper recognizes sportsmen and women's careers, highlight the fact that this is "a stimulus, and at the same time a commitment. It is a stimulus providing incentives for growth and a commitment to continue working with the same energy."

"Clarín" also awarded four special prizes including one to Jon Uriarte, Nicolás's father, who made his debut as the Argentinean Volleyball

trainer in the World League 2006, with a second place in group B, based on seven victories against Portugal (4) and Finland (3). Now, he is waiting to find out whether he will be able to participate in the Beijing Olympics in 2008.

In the Argentinean press, they emphasize that the National Team "is looking to

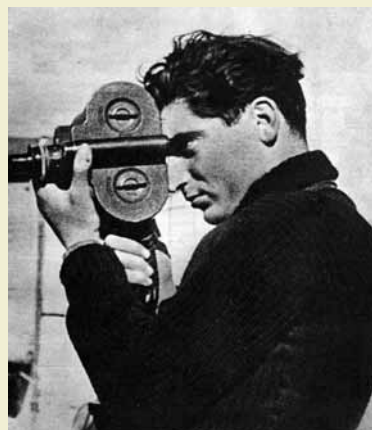
recover its identity whilst undergoing a renewal process, continually led by its ideologist: Jon Uriarte".

Top players in the Juvenile Team are also mentioned including Nicolás Uriarte again, "Jon's son, a 1.90 m play-maker with the talent to take on the very best."

3000 unpublished photographs by Robert Capa discovered in Mexico

More than 3000 unpublished photographs from the Spanish Civil War taken by Robert Capa have been discovered in Mexico after remaining hidden for 68 years. The pictures were in 127 rolls of film which, in 1940, fell into the hands of the Mexican General Francisco Aguilar González, who fought in the Mexican revolution under Pancho Villa.

Almost 70 years later, the filmmaker Trisha Ziff located the photos through Aguilar González's descendants. Some of these pictures were taken by Gerda Taro, Capa's companion, and they show combat action and scenes from the Civil War in Spain. Capa is considered the best wartime photographer in history who provided the most gripping portrait of the Spanish Civil War.
