





Welcome message




Welcome to the Eleventh Session of the World Urban Forum, which is taking place for the first time in the Eastern European region, in Katowice, Poland.

Dear Honourable Guests,

On behalf of the Polish government, we are honoured to welcome you to the Eleventh Session of the World Urban Forum in Katowice. We are proud that Poland and Katowice are hosting an event where the future of cities is being shaped.

This is the first time that the World Urban Forum is being held in Central and Eastern Europe. This is a region that has come a long way - from communist rule, which had little regard for human life, let alone its quality, to democratic governments working for the common good.

Our country, Poland, has also taken this path. Today, Polish cities are centres of business and culture. Their dynamic development makes them attractive not only to domestic but also to foreign investors. The International Congress Centre, where WUF11 is being held, the National Polish Radio Symphony Orchestra building right across the street, and the nearby Silesian Museum are all facilities built on the site of a former coal mine.

These wonderful buildings are part of an entirely revitalised area now called the Culture Zone, where significant political and economic events, as well as concerts by world-famous artists, take place. Culture is life, and Katowice puts culture first. This is a perfect example of how to breathe new life into a city, something which we should all aim for.

We are convinced that many more positive stories will be told at WUF11. After all, it is not only in Poland or Europe that cities are transforming themselves. Behind this change are hundreds of thousands, if not millions, of people working to build responsible and supportive cities. Each person here at WUF11 has the chance to share their achievements and show how to create liveable, welcoming cities.

However, urban history also has a dark side. Pandemics, natural disasters, wars, poverty – all of us have witnessed these scourges that affect cities most strongly. As Poles, we know how grave moments of challenge can be. It is through overcoming great trials that we are an independent state today. This is why we remember all those who are facing crisis at the moment in countries affected by war, aggression and disaster, such as our neighbour Ukraine, and continue to provide assistance to countries, territories and areas affected by conflict and disaster. 


Dear Participants,

About the World Urban Forum and WUF11

World Urban Forum

The World Urban Forum (WUF) was established by the United Nations in 2001 to examine one of the most pressing issues facing the world today: rapid urbanisation and its impact on communities, cities, economies and climate change. Over the past two decades, WUF has evolved into the premier global conference on sustainable urbanization.

Organised and convened by the United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-Habitat), WUF is one of the most inclusive international gatherings on urban issues. It brings together representatives of national, regional and local governments, academics, business people, community leaders, urban planners and civil society representatives.

The first WUF took place in Nairobi, Kenya in 2002 and has since been held around the world every two years.





KATOWICE, POLAND | 26-30 JUNE 2022

The Eleventh Session of the World Urban Forum (WUF11) is taking place at the International Congress Centre in Katowice, Poland from 26 to 30 June 2022. This will be the first WUF in Eastern and Central Europe and will offer hybrid (in-person and online) participation in most sessions and discussion events, including the opening and closing sessions.

WUF11 is co-organized with the Polish Ministry of Development Funds and Regional Policy and the Municipal Office of Katowice. The theme of the forum, Transforming Our Cities for a Better Urban Future, seeks to strengthen relationships and develop action and policy to improve urban environments, in the context of achieving Sustainable Development Goal 11 – "making cities inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable."

WUF11 will include an extraordinary dialogue on urban crisis response and recovery in light of the war in Ukraine. The conflict has had a devastating impact on the whole region, including Poland, which has received more than three million Ukrainian refugees.







Assemblies

Created to give voice to key stakeholder groups from broader segments of society, assemblies particularly instrumental to support an inclusive and participatory decision-making process for a scaled up implementation of the New Urban Agenda.

Dialogues

The dialogues are high profile events that set the agenda for policy and action throughout the forum and beyond.

Roundtables

These action-oriented sessions enable peers to exchange views on key urban issues. Some roundtables will be closed door events, while others will be open to the public.

Special Sessions

A number of Special Sessions on topics of importance of the forum or the host region; or topical issues of the day will be organised by UN-Habitat and the host city.

Networking Events

Opportunities for participants with shared interests in specific areas of sustainable urbanization to exchange ideas, share knowledge and experiences, strengthen partnerships and build communities of best practices to advance sustainable and inclusive urban development.

Training Events

Aimed at transferring practical skills and knowledge in specific areas related to the WUF 11 theme - Transforming our Cities for a Better Urban Future. Training sessions will equip participants with the know-how and tools to address development challenges in the context of dynamic cultural shifts and rapid technological innovation.

Caucus Meetings

These are informed meetings held between peers every morning before the main events take place and mainly focus on the topics of the day.

Urban Library

The Urban Library room is designed to broaden understanding of a more sustainable urban environment and develop solutions and networks to achieve this.

ONE UN Events

The UN room fosters collaboration between the various UN agencies during WUF11.

Voices from Cities

Created in order to produce effective actionbased solutions to the problems of sustainable development.



SDGs in Action

This highlights hands-on examples of implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals - the world's to-do list to end poverty, reduce inequalities and tackle climate change.

Urban Cinema

The UN-Habitat Better Cities Film Festival at WUF believes in the power of storytelling to inspire and empower cities and communities. The Urban Cinema room as a result will be a space that fosters civic pride, builds community and sparks our collective imagination for a better future.

UN-Habitat Arena

UN-Habitat's vision of a better quality of life for all in an urbanizing world is on display in the UN-Habitat Arena.

The Arena will showcase evidence of the transformative change in cities and human settlements being supported by UN-Habitat, through knowledge, policy advice, technical assistance and collaborative action.

WUF Legacy

WUF legacy projects include: the WUF Alumni Network and the Cities Investment Fair and Project Showcase.

Press Conference Centre Events

Sessions at the WUF11 The HUB: Press Conference Centre will bring together urban journalists and media practitioners, organizations and institutions that want to share latest news or present important initiatives. Press events are open to all accredited media representatives and participants.

European Track

Transforming European Cities: for a Better Europe, for a Better World

The block of events dedicated to the European dimension of urbanization in the context of global challenges organized by the Polish Ministry of Development Funds and Regional Policy and the Institute of Urban and Regional Development in cooperation with institutions and organizations shaping urban policies in European countries and cities.

WUF in the City Events

The 11 Urban Zones will focus on the idea of sustainable urbanization spreading throughout the whole city of Katowice and the entire Metropolitan Area. The main aim is to engage residents, WUF11 participants and other visitors to the events. The zones are open to everyone and will showcase a vast range of events accompanied by a cultural programme.

By definition, grassroots organisations are almost invariably on the frontline of the response and recovery efforts to any kind of crisis – public health, climate- or conflict-related. Multiple crises have highlighted and exacerbated many of the chronic stresses poor urban communities have to cope with.

The Grassroots Assembly will focus on how organised grassroots groups are addressing current urban challanges. It will discuss how effective solutions to 'build back better' must accelerate progress towards a more sustainable, inclusive and resilient future.

Children and Youth Assembly (Interpretation including Ukrainian)

Special Session Room 2

The Children and Youth Assembly will serve as a space to share, report and galvanize youth action for sustainable urbanization. It will promote participatory dialogue through high-level panels, plenary sessions, training workshops and networking opportunities. These sessions will bring together youth organisations, local and national government, academia, civil society and the private sector. To strengthen diversity and global participation, the Children and Youth Assembly will be held in a hybrid - in-person and online - format. It will culminate with the adoption of a Youth DeclarACTION on Sustainable Urbanization.

World Assembly of Local and Regional Governments

The World Assembly of Local and Regional Governments is organized by the Global Taskforce of Local and Regional Governments and facilitated by United Cities and Local Governments

The World Assembly has been officially recognized by the United Nations General Assembly for the role local and regional governments play in sustainable urban development and in the implementation of the New Urban Agenda. It offers a mechanism through which local and regional governments provide inputs to the global agenda, building on the expertise of communities. This event will follow up on the commitments set forward during the high-level meeting on the review of the New Urban Agenda in New York in April 2022.



Women's Assembly

Special Session Room 1

The Women's Assembly is a key meeting point for participants working to build peaceful, sustainable and women-friendly cities. It will serve as a space to share tools, strategies, plans, actions and perspectives on the implementation of the New Urban Agenda and its role in promoting womenfriendly cities.

UN-Habitat recognizes that gender mainstreaming is key to developing solutions for accelerating progress towards achieving the SDGs and implementing the New Urban Agenda, as well as women's empowerment. In line with the forum's theme Transforming Our Cities for a Better Urban Future, the Women's Assembly will focus on how implementating the New Urban Agenda with a gendered lens can play a key role in contributing to inclusive urban development.

Business Assembly

Roundtable Room 2

The Business Assembly will bring business leaders together to discuss how business can transform our cities in line with the SDGs. It will focus on key industry sectors, including mobility, technology, housing and finance, and will demonstrate how each sector can facilitate a more just, green and resilient urban future.

The Assembly will review the role of business in supporting the needs of refugees that have moved to cities, and the needs for recovery and reconstruction in destroyed areas. It aims to equip businesses with necessary frameworks to contribute to the quickest recovery of cities affected by conflict, including those in Ukraine, and to support refugee-hosting communities in line with the principles of sustainable development.

Monday, 27 June 2022

Extraordinary Dialogue on Urban Crisis Response and Recovery

(Interpretation including Ukrainian)

13:30 – 15:30 **Auditorium**

The climate emergency, the massive disruption of the COVID-19 pandemic, the global housing crisis, growing inequality, the breakdown of the social contract and the increasing urban nature of conflict, are having devastating impacts on cities, leaving some people and places behind.

This dialogue will reflect on these growing urban crises and the role of mayors and city leaders as both first responders and visionaries who can accelerate not just recovery but transformation towards a better urban future

Crises are affecting the physical fabric of our cities but, more importantly, displacing people at an increasing scale. The war in Ukraine alone has forced more than 11 million people from their homes in just a few months. By May 2022, Poland was hosting 3.3 million Ukrainian refugees. This requires new thinking on how this will affect

the urban landscape, how host communities and the displaced can sustain their lives, and how ultimately people can return home or build new lives elsewhere. This dialogue will zoom in on the essential elements of a holistic response to urban crises.

Dialogue 1: **Equitable Urban Futures** (Interpretation including Portuguese)

10:00 - 12:00

Spodek Arena

The vision of an equitable urban future is hindered by persisting poverty, discrimination, violence and exclusion. Inequity in rights and opportunities to live a peaceful, safe and dignified life is perpetuating multiple forms of marginalization, suffered by the homeless, immigrants, ethnic minorities, refugees and persons with disabilities.

To be leaders in transformation, cities require appropriate legislative frameworks supported by competent urban planning and management that are well financed. This dialogue will bring together a diverse group of officials and professionals to shed light on new policies and partnerships that are helping to fulfil the right to affordable housing, and adequate social and health services, and which recognize new frontiers in progressing equity.

Dialogue 2: Building Resilience for Sustainable Urban Futures

10:00 - 12:00

Auditorium

The COVID-19 pandemic has shown that urban areas must continually adapt to challenges in an integrated and holistic manner. At the same time, such shocks and threats can be catalysed to transform societies.

Urban resilience to climate change has gained momentum recently. Now it is important to examine new ways to increase successful practices to support cities, especially in small island developing states, less developed countries and low- and middle-income countries. Many are highly vulnerable to climate shocks and crises, but have limited internal capacities and resources.

Dialogue 3: Future Urban Economy and Finance

(Interpretation including Portuguese)

The global view of financing development in low- and medium-income countries is changing. The focus is shifting from dispersed grants to supporting major investment in infrastructure. This shift inevitably raises questions about the relation of urban development to the structural and economic transformation of a country. It will look at examples of this approach, such as the prospective territorial-industrial atlas for attracting investment attraction to Mexico.

The dialogue will explore how urbanization and structural transformation can be supported by more coherent investment through national, sub-national and external financing.

Dialogue 4: Integrated Governance in Spatial Planning for a More Just, Green and Healthy Urban Future (Interpretation including Portuguese)

10:00 - 12:00 **Auditorium**

The COVID-19 pandemic has amplified existing inequalities and exacerbated spatial and socioeconomic inequality, climate change and the need for digital transformation. These challenges however present opportunities to integrate multi-level governance into urban development through spatial planning.

Multi-level governance involves broad consultative processes incorporating vertical and horizontal collaboration across a range of actors and government levels, formal and informal institutions, and the public, private and social sectors. Spatial planning, meanwhile, should among other qualities be rooted in human rights, take a global perspective, secure political legitimacy and capitalise on the special characteristics of places.

By 2050, more than two-thirds of the world population will be living in cities – an increase of 2.5 billion people requiring transformation of today's cities and providing opportunity, as many new cities are still to be built. Innovative solutions and technologies will play an important role in ensuring future cities are more people-centred, inclusive, safe, resilient and environmentally friendly.

As centres of economic development, and cultural and social exchange, cities have always catalysed innovation. Their role has become even more important with the challenges of the global pandemic, the climate crisis and rapid urbanization. The dialogue will bring diverse stakeholders together to discuss the opportunities and challenges of our Future Cities 2050.

Dialogue 6: **Greener Urban Futures** (Interpretation including Portuguese)

Auditorium

The climate emergency is a defining challenge of our time. Experts have warned that without drastic reductions in greenhouse gas emissions, global warming will not be held to the target of 1.5 °C above pre-industrial levels. As confirmed at

COP26, it is within cities – which account for nearly 70 percent of global greenhouse gas emissions – that we must take action to meet the global goal of carbon neutrality by the end of the century. This dialogue will explore and provide insights on how cities can transition to a sustainable urban future. It will bring stakeholders from different backgrounds to discuss the nexus between science, policy, and global and local climate action.

Monday, 27 June 2022

1. Local and Regional Governments Roundtable

(Interpretation including Portuguese)

16:00 - 18:00

Roundtable Room 1

With six out of every ten people in the world expected to reside in urban areas by 2030, rising to nearly 70 percent by 2050, cities are where the future of sustainability will be defined. Local and regional governments and leaders are facing critical challenges in the provision of public services, including housing, health, digitalization and financing, which have been exacerbated by conflicts, health emergencies and climate change. This session aims to facilitate discussions on how to cities can raise their potential and improve citizens' lives, while re-imagining the future of our cities.

2. Business and Industries Roundtable 16:00 – 18:00

Auditorium

This roundtable will commence with a case study on a people-centred urban transformation in the inner city of Toronto. Then, reflecting global shifts towards values-driven business and investment, the roundtable will discuss how this can be harnessed by cities to attract the right types of business to drive transformation and achieve the SDGs. There will be a presentation of the Lagos Water Transport Project, which further illustrates the potential for businesses to drive sustainable urban development.

It will also explore ways to systematize knowledge-sharing on the investment priorities of cities, successful business, private-public partnerships and blended finance models, and explore mechanisms to channel investment and business partnerships to cities.

3. National Urban Policies in a Changing World Roundtable – led by Poland

Roundtable Room 2

Hosted by the Polish Ministry of Development Funds and Regional Policy and facilitated by the European Urban Knowledge Network (EUKN), this roundtable will investigate opportunities to strengthen cities' resilience and aim to deepen the understanding of the relationship between national urban policies and contemporary crises. The roundtable will also provide a platform for high-level discussion on the potential of national urban policies to address challenges in the fields of environment, housing, mobility, spatial planning and innovation and technology.

The discussion will take place through the prism of the new Polish National Urban Policy 2030 which will be presented during this roundtable.

4. Parliamentarians Roundtable

Roundtable Room 1

Global milestones such as the Sustainable Development Goals and the New Urban Agenda have provided opportunities and support for member states to address urbanization. Visible national-level efforts geared towards responding to the challenges and opportunities of the urban world include the prioritization of development frameworks for infrastructure, housing, health, education, climate change, and women's and children's rights. In most cases these efforts remain an issue fully managed by the national government, but the 2030 Agenda can only be achieved if lawmakers and decision makers support initiatives that involve all actors, including non-governmental entities. The roundtable will look at global efforts currently underway to strengthen the role of all partners.

5. Older Persons Roundtable

13:30 - 15:30

Roundtable Room 2

This roundtable is a key meeting point for participants working to build sustainable, age-responsive and inclusive cities. It will serve as a space to share tools, strategies, and actions on the implementation of the New Urban Agenda and its role in promoting age-friendly cities.

This roundtable discussion will explore the interactions between age-friendly cities initiatives and other strategic agendas such as smart cities, enhanced social integration and inclusive communities, and access to affordable and adequate housing. It will also present best practices used by UN-Habitat, local and national governments, stakeholders and partners in age-friendly city initiatives.

6. Ministerial Roundtable

16:00 - 18:00

Roundtable Room 1

This roundtable will bring together ministers and senior representatives of national governments and regional political bodies to elevate the debate on sustainable urbanization to accelerate the implementation of the New Urban Agenda in support of the Sustainable Development Goals and other global agendas.

This roundtable is expected to come up with a set of forward-looking urban policy measures to transform our cities and human settlements towards a sustainable urban future, particularly for the post COVID-19 era, which can be adapted and replicated at different levels and in different contexts.

7. Persons with Disabilities Roundtable

16:00 - 18:00

Roundtable Room 2

This roundtable will serve as a space to discuss and share experiences, strategies, tools and actions for the implementation of the New Urban Agenda and urban dimension of the SDGs, in line with the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD). It will gather a wide diversity of stakeholders, including across government levels, urban practitioners, organisations of persons with disabilities, academia and representatives from the older persons' constituency.

Persons with disabilities form 15 percent of the global population but are disproportionately represented in the poorest quantile, facing challenges from discriminatory laws and policies, and lack of services that enable the enjoyment of their rights. Much remains be done to address discrimination and accessibility barriers which sustain inequalities and exclusion of persons with disabilities.

Wednesday, 29 June 2022

8. One UN Roundtable

13:30 - 15:30

Roundtable Room 1

This roundtable will build upon the recent review of the implementation of the New Urban Agenda and the high-level meeting of the UN General Assembly in April 2022. It will provide an analysis of current efforts to integrate housing and urban development into the Common Country Analyses and the United Nations Sustainable Development Cooperation Frameworks. The session will present the United Nations Development Coordination Office (UNDCO) and UN-Habitat joint initiative to enhance country level programming on urban development to assist member states in the implementation of the New Urban Agenda for the achievement of the SDGs.

9. Women's Roundtable

13:30 - 15:30

Roundtable Room 2

This roundtable will serve as a space to discuss and share experiences, strategies and actions for the implementation of the New Urban Agenda and urban dimensions of the SDGs. Women often carry an extra burden, and often experience greater difficulty in accessing urban resources and services tailored to their needs, as well as decision-making opportunities and positions. Gender equality and inclusion are

emphasized in the New Urban Agenda as transformative commitments.

This meeting will focus on how implementing the New Urban Agenda supports mainstreaming gender equality and women's empowerment in human settlements. The roundtable will create an opportunity for women to share innovative ways to bring their voices into the planning and development process. Speakers will vary from national and local government, individual women and civil society groups and well as professionals and academics.

10. Academia Roundtable

13:30 - 15:30

Auditorium

This event brings together representatives from academic institutions around the world to discuss the role of academia in the implementation of the 2030 Agenda, specifically SDG 11 and components of SDG 4 (quality and inclusive education for all) in line with the global frameworks for urban sustainability and education.

Important global agendas continually underscore the need for innovative research that serves as the catalyst for evidence-based, well-informed and impactful policies. This event aims to bring to the fore the role of innovation in research and higher education in achieving this.

11. Professionals Roundtable

Roundtable Room 1

Professionals from more than 24 built environment international associations will gather at this roundtable convened by the Habitat Professional Forum. The event will be an interactive conversation to inform and engage audiences on four strategic topics discussed through the lens of WUF11's key dialogue themes. Conclusions from these discussions will inform the next work plan of the Habitat Professional Forum and its efforts to mobilize professionals globally towards sustainable urban development.


12. Foundations and Philanthropies Roundtable

Cities have become younger — most of the three billion people under the age of 25 live in urban areas, and it is estimated that 60 percent of the urban population will be under the age of 18 by 2030. This is happening in parallel with growing inequity, lack of access to basic services and increased violence.

Young people are an integral factor in sustaining peace. In recent years there has been a significant shift towards recognizing young people and their roles in the maintenance and promotion of international peace and security.

This roundtable will feature a special UN-Habitat initiative, Youth 2030 Cities, that seeks to build the capacity of youth leaders, and aims to promote the meaningful participation of young people towards sustainable urbanization

The roundtable will reflect on the contributions of civil society and grassroots organizations, local and national governments, private sector and other partners in forming and promoting cocreation frameworks. Special emphasis will be placed on the pre-conditions and systems needed to scale co-creation.

15. Trade Union and Workers Roundtable

If SDG11 and the New Urban Agenda's transformative commitments are to be realised, cities must be built on principles of social, economic and environmental justice.

Workers and unions are active shapers of progressive urban development and policymaking and should be included from the outset of any process. Workers build cities, operate the local public administration, deliver vital public services to residents, and bring the communities and the local economies to life

This roundtable will gather workers and union representatives to highlight how we can implement SDG11 and the New Urban Agenda in a post-COVID-19 environment. It will discuss the opportunities to improve territorial inequality by enhancing equitable access to local public services, sustainable urban planning and transformative policy measures.

Special Session: **Urban Recovery Frameworks**

(Interpretation including Turkish)

Special Session Room 1

In an urbanizing world, the impact of climate change, natural disasters, pandemics, conflict and war is increasingly urban. Urban crises result in the destruction of neighbourhoods, infrastructure and urban economies, which goes hand in hand with massive displacement of populations both within cities, across territories and national boundaries.

Urban recovery requires not just a focus on places suffering physical damage but also on places hosting the displaced. Work at different levels is needed from the neighbourhood, to city-level and subregions. The session will draw on practices from a wide range of countries and reflect on what will be key elements to urban recovery in Ukraine, in complement to national level reconstruction plans.

Special Session: **Urban Data and Circular Economy**(Interpretation including Portuguese)

(interpretation including Portuguese)

16:00 - 18:00

Special Session Room 2

This special session will look at how urban data can help achieve equitable, sustainable and inclusive urban development, alongside the opportunities of promoting the circular economy in the built environment. It will gather decision-makers, businesses, public authorities, NGOs, knowledge institutions and civil society organisations to discuss ways to advance the transition to a circular economy and how data gathering can help advance this transition. It will also look at the innovative technologies and platforms that collect, generate and analyse data to support data driven governance.

Poland Special Session: Rebuilding Communities and Neighbourhoods After War and Natural Disasters (Interpretation including Ukrainian) 13:30 – 15:30

Auditorium

The war in Ukraine, the refugee crisis in Poland and in other countries hosting refugees from Ukraine, as well as natural disasters affecting various parts of the world, show how important the human aspect is in the social and economic recovery of post-conflict areas. Huge losses in housing infrastructure, rapid impoverishment of the population and mass migrations cause loss of stability that in the long-term may lead to a slowdown or even the end of the recovery process.

This session will reflect on how to involve organizations and institutions in the rebuilding process. In addition to expert discussions, it will be an opportunity to hear from cities that have experienced conflicts and natural disasters.

Special Session: National Urban
Forums - Strategic Platforms for
Implementing the SDGs and the New
Urban Agenda

13:30 - 15:30

Special Session Room 1

National Urban Forums (NUFs) are multi-stakeholder platforms to facilitate meaningful and inclusive participation in policy debates on sustainable urban development. At WUF9, the Kuala Lumpur Declaration on Cities 2030 called for supporting "the creation and consolidation of inclusive platforms and agendas for dialogue among all levels of government, decision-makers and stakeholders." WUF10 gathered previous hosts of NUFs to advance lessons learned and share ideas on how to enhance such platforms.

This session will provide an opportunity to take those discussions further and share innovative mechanisms for advancing the role of multi-stakeholder platforms to scale-up efforts to localize the SDGs. An important element of this discussion will be how NUFs can be a platform for long-term solutions in a humanitarian crisis, given the current situation in Europe.

Special Session: **Delivering Affordable Housing Across Continents**

13:30 - 15:30

Special Session Room 2

The spread of COVID-19 has exacerbated a pre-existing global housing crisis, which was already affecting millions of people. As COVID-19 spread around the world, billions of people were told to stay at home. However, this simple preventative public health measure was and is impossible for people who are homeless, or live in unsafe or overcrowded housing. The absence of basic services, stress and unhealthy living conditions also contribute to poor health. Housing is a fundamental human right and has been central in the battle against COVID-19. The special session will discuss the challenges posed by the market failure to provide adequate, safe, and affordable housing for low-income and vulnerable populations in Europe and in Africa.

Special Session: Tackling Urban Health Challenges in a Changing World

16:00 - 18:00

Auditorium

As the world transitions through a global pandemic and against a background of unprecedented urbanization, extreme climate events and conflicts, the health of urban populations is increasingly at risk. Health services are pushed to breaking point and often classic public health interventions are the only option to protect vulnerable citizens. Additionally, the COVID-19 pandemic has worsened existing health inequities.

Rethinking urban space is thus important to tackle health both in the redesign of existing cities and towns, and also for the many urban areas yet to be built. This session will present a range of health challenges faced by city leaders and some of the new approaches to managing disease, including tracking, managing epidemics and prevention through improved urban design.

Special Session: The City We Need Now!

(Interpretation including Portuguese)

16:00 - 18:00

Special Session Room 1

The City We Need Now! is an advocacy campaign led by UN-Habitat and more than 220 partner organizations of the World Urban Campaign, calling for urgent action because the world is not on course to achieve the SDGs by 2030.

The campaign demonstrates how cities can become accelerators of the New Urban Agenda and the 2030 Development Agenda. It does so in six regions: Africa, the Middle East and Arab States, Asia-Pacific, Europe and the CIS, North America, and Latin America and the Caribbean. The campaign focuses on ten action areas to accelerate change to yield big results through effective partnerships and innovation.

The session will call upon key partners of The City We Need Now! to explain action areas towards the implementation of the New Urban Agenda and address gaps in SDGs achievements. Participants in the room will be encouraged to share their views in the ten action areas of The City We Need Now! campaign.

Special Session: Climate Adaptation and Nature-Based Solutions for Resilient Cities

16:00 - 18:00

Special Session Room 2

Nature-based solutions, blue-green and hybrid infrastructure, and other integrated approaches offer a transformative opportunity to enhance climate resilience, while delivering benefits supporting basic urban services.

Although many cities have developed adaptation plans and incorporated nature-based measures, challenges in implementation remain evident. This special session will highlight the benefits of nature-based solutions for climate resilience in cities. It will be an inclusive dialogue to urge an integrated approach to adaptation. It will also explore the challenges countries face when translating their adaptation plans into action.



Wednesday, 29 June 2022

Special Session: Prerequisites for Productive Investment in Infrastructure and Sustainable Urban Development 13:30 – 15:30

Special Session room 1

For urbanization to serve as a vehicle for economic development of a country, it is key that more effective and productive investments in urban infrastructure and services underpin structural transformation. Furthermore, the structural transformation process and related investment should be conceived in a way that enhances shared prosperity and improves quality of life, with the aim of leaving no-one behind.

This session will attempt to remove some of the bottlenecks within current multilevel governance frameworks and the integration of spatial and investment planning and public and private finance. Experts will share practical experiences from around the world and discuss how to overcome the current challenges.

Special Session: Localizing the SDGs 13:30 – 15:30

Special Session Room 2

All the SDGs have targets which are directly or indirectly related to the daily work of local and regional governments and local stakeholders. While the SDGs are global in their ambition, their achievement will depend on local action and local leadership.

SDG localization is the process of transforming the SDGs into reality at the local level, in line with national frameworks and with communities' priorities. To be successful, localization needs to be anchored in the principles of inclusion, partnership and multilevel governance, and to build on adequate data and financing availability at the local level.

This session aims to create an engaging debate with a wide array of stakeholders from different spheres of government and sectors. It is an opportunity to present and discuss the main global initiatives on SDG localization supported by the United Nations system and by UN-Habitat.

Special Session: **Shaping Equitable Urban Futures**

(Interpretation including Turkish) 16:00 - 18:00

Special Session Room 1

Inequity is built into the fabric of cities. Patterns of segregation within the physical environment determine access to social and economic opportunities for different communities, systemically depriving some and rewarding others. Housing in many cities is growing more and more unaffordable for residents, with prices rising due to largely unfettered flows of capital investments. At the same time, urban systems of governance are often chronically underfunded and can lack responsiveness to local challenges.

This session will centre on the importance of reshaping narratives and approaches to urban governance and planning for a more equitable, sustainable and healthy futures. Featuring pioneering urban leaders who are structuring their administrations around new narratives and systems of governance such as gender equality and care, the session will explore both the theoretical underpinnings of these approaches and the practical challenges of their implementation.

Special Session: Accelerating Post Covid-19 Recovery, Social Inclusion and Urban Inequality Reduction in Communities

16:00 - 18:00

Special Session Room 2

The crisis generated by the COVID-19 pandemic has shown that urban action at the neighborhood level has the potential to generate direct impacts and benefits on the quality of life and the exercise of human rights of all people. Neighborhood action allows for the promotion of close, compact and connected city models, which in turn work as strategies for social inclusion, as well as for the adaptation and mitigation of climate change.

This special session will highlight best practices of intervention at the neighborhood level that have been implemented to address the effects of the pandemic in different countries of the global south.

Special Session Room 1

Smart cities have the potential to use digital technologies and data to guide better decision-making with respect to prosperity, sustainability, resilience, emergency management or effective and equitable service delivery. This session takes stock of recent initiatives on inclusive smart cities. The urban digital transformation needs to be more aligned with national and local priorities, people's needs, inclusion and human rights considerations, environmental sustainability, resilience and climate action - as set out in the New Urban Agenda and the 2030 Sustainable Development Agenda. Cities as varied as London, Barcelona, Warsaw, Johannesburg, Buenos Aires, Sao Paolo, Singapore and Seoul are taking a more human-centric

approach to smart city transition.

IntegrHabitat was born as a strategy to lead, promote and accomplish effective integration in cities facing social, economic and territorial struggles related to the arrival of traditionally vulnerable populations. IntegrHabitat centres are developing successful and innovative approaches to cope with this challenge and effectively

Data Tools and Instruments to Assess and Follow Up Territorial Integration 17:00 – 18:00

The Inclusive Cities, Communities of Solidarity project has developed a territorial integration approach for Venezuelan refugees and migrants and proposes strategic solutions to tackle territorial demands to transform migration into an asset for shared prosperity. The project has developed information tools to support national and local authorities in decision-making, as well as in the formulation of multilevel recommendations to build more inclusive cities that will leave no one behind.



UN-Habitat Urban Laboratory Interactive Space

The Urban Lab is an interactive space at the UN-Habitat Arena for urban professionals and a general audience to express their opinions, offer feedback and exchange ideas. This space provides opportunities to engage WUF visitors in a wide range of activities: lab jam sessions, urban board games, open microphone sessions, participatory activities and discussions with partners, short presentations of projects and products, brochure and flyer distribution, and general assistance.

Financing Dialogue for Capacity-Building: Develop Partnerships and Programmes to Multiply Impact and Design a Pathway to Excellence 11:00 – 12:00

A radical shift from unsustainable practices to innovative approaches is needed to support future resilience, inclusion, green and economic sustainability in cities. Capacity-building is critical to ensure that technical cadres and decision-makers are equipped with the right knowledge, tools and skills to drive this shift. While many cities have undergone substantial social, economic, spatial and physical transformation, the human and administrative capacities of municipal and local governments have failed to keep pace. This is particularly true in fragile settings and for intermediate cities and towns, often

characterized by high urbanization rates. UN-Habitat and key partners will discuss means of implementation and financing opportunities, whilst calling for champion countries and partners to support the development of largescale and innovative capacity-buliding programmes.

Our City Plans Digital Platform: Customizing Participatory Planning Processes

12:30 - 13:30

Our City Plans toolbox has been transformed into an interactive digital platform that will be launched at WUF11. This is a global toolbox that guides and supports local governments and urban actors to better understand, tailor and develop inclusive and integrated urban planning processes, using a participatory and incremental methodology. During this launch event, participants will experience how the methodology can be customised to adapt the urban planning process to their needs and local context

Go Blue – Connecting People, Cities and the Ocean for a Sustainable and Resilient Kenyan Coast

14:00 - 15:00

The event will discuss the development of an integrated, ecosystem-based, land-sea planning framework that guides all other spatial planning and management activities for sustainable use and conservation of the blue economy in Kenya's six coastal counties - Mombasa, Kwale, Kilifi, Lamu, Taita Taveta and Tana River - under the coast regional economic block. The event will demonstrate the project's capacity to address key human settlements and environmental challenges facing the blue economy in Africa. It will showcase community-led, low-cost technologies and approaches for stimulating benefits from coastal cities and the blue economy.

Innovations in Learning for a Better Urban Future: the UN-Habitat Learn Platform and the New Urban Agenda Illustrated Toolkit

15:30 - 16:30

The event will present and discuss innovative approaches, challenges and opportunities related to digital innovation for capacity-building on urban sustainability. The discussion will be based on UN-Habitat's learning platform UN-Habitat Learn as well as the flagship capacity-building toolkit the New Urban Agenda Illustrated, available both as a handbook and an online course in two parts. The event will be interactive, varying presentations by UN-Habitat experts with polling and moderated discussions with key partners.

SDGs and the New Urban Agenda Implementation: the Role of Regional Governments in Latin America and the Caribbean

17:00 - 18:00

UN-Habitat has been implementing strategic projects in Latin America and the Caribbean to strength regional governance with data-based solutions, reinforce urban-rural linkages and promote urban actions as a way to implement the New Urban Aagenda and advance the SDGs in the region. This event will hightlights the examples, tools and lessons learned from two initiatives in Brazil and Ecuador.

Flagship 1: Inclusive Vibrant Neighbourhoods and Communities 09:30 – 10:30

The session will present the progress of the UN-Habitat urban regeneration programme and showcase the impact of regeneration to transform urban environments, from the perspective of a government, a community and the contribution of the private sector. Outstanding initiatives, projects, plans, programmes and policies from the public and private sector and from civil society and community organisations will be presented by different countries.

Flagship 2: People-Centered Smart Cities

11:00 - 12:00

The New Urban Agenda calls for the adoption of a "smart city approach that makes use of digitalization, clean energy and technologies". Unfortunately, in many smart city, urban innovation and digital transformation projects, technology has been applied uncritically, based on supply rather than demand, and often fails to fully consider the real needs of local governments, city residents or the broader aims of urban sustainability and inclusion. Lack of capacity and limited resources affect many local governments, jeopardizing their ability to identify and procure appropriate technologies that meet their people's needs.

Flagship 3: RISE UP for Climate Resilience in Vulnerable Settlements 12:30 – 13:30

The world stands at a crossroads in its efforts to take action to mitigate climate change and adapt to its effects. Whichever road we turn down, the path has to pass through cities. Time is running out to implement policies that will keep warming well below 2°C, as called for in the Paris Agreement, while also financing the adaptation actions need to cope with the impacts of climate change. One of the greatest challenges for climate change adaptation is building resilience, particularly for the one billion urban dwellers in informal settlements. Such populations often find themselves caught between unplanned, inefficient urban expansion, and vulnerable natural habitats. The pandemic has exposed deep inequalities in how people live in cities, and how cities serve their residents.

Flagship 4: Inclusive Cities: Enhancing the Positive Impacts of Urban Migration 14:00 – 15:00

Migration is at the core of urbanization, and while today cities are home to 54 percent of the world's population, by 2050 this number is expected to rise to 66 percent. The total number of international migrants in 2020 was estimated at 280.6 million. A total of 82.4 million were forcibly displaced due to conflict and violence in several regions and countries.

By May 2022 the conflict in Ukraine alone had pushed nearly 14 million people out of their places of origin both within Ukraine and beyond its borders. Climate change is driving displacement and increasing the vulnerability of those already forced to flee.

While the movement of large populations poses a variety of challenges to towns and cities, migration and displacement can boost productivity, enhance local economic development and strengthen urban-rural economic and social linkages.

Flagship 5: SDG Cities: Accelerating the Localization of the SDGs for a Sustainable Urban Future 15:30 – 16:30

A decade ago, the world shifted irreversibly from being mostly rural to considerably urban. Today, 55% of the global population lives in urban areas and this is set to increase to 68% by 2050 as a further 2.3 billion people, due to demographic trends are added to the urban population. Cities now generate 80% of the world's economy, and most countries that have urbanized have experienced economic growth. Urbanisation done well is recognized as an accelerator for sustainable development that can leave no one and no place behind, however poorly planned, and managed cities can cause greater inequality and environmental degradation.

The SDG Cities Global Initiative provides a structured way to support cities to accelerate the achievement of SDGs improving quality of life and driving positive social, economic, and environmental impact. It systematizes a sequence of data collection, analysis, and city development planning. Based on this it identifies projects that have a measurable impact on SDGs, prepares them for finance and matchmakes them with sources of investment so that they can be implemented. It also seeks to strengthen local institutions capacities as relevant to ensure effectiveness in driving sustainable urban development. It then provides global recognition of the efforts of cities to accelerate the achievement of SDGs through SDG Cities Certification.

SDG Cities aims to reach 1000 cities and impact on 1 billion lives. To do this, UN-Habitat has established a user-friendly digital toolkit covering areas of urban data collection and analysis, institutional capacity assessment and training, and has established a Cities Investment Facility with UNCDF. The tools are currently being piloted in Bolivia, Ecuador, Ghana, Morocco, Tunisia, and Malaysia. Scale is also reached through partnerships, where partners may adopt, adapt, and implement the available tools and processes. The initiative is set to go to scale on World Cities Day 31 October 2022.

This event is a space for dialogue to promote a new paradigm of sustainable industrial development, based on the proper management of a territory and the promotion of agglomeration economies, which supports the socioeconomic recovery process in the context of COVID-19, particularly in Mexico and Latin America, but with the potential to be replicated in other contexts. The experience of Mexico in the development of a prospective territorial-industrial atlas for investment attraction will be presented.

Thursday, 30 June 2022

WUF Legacy Projects

The WUF Legacy Projects were an initiative of UN-Habitat in collaboration with the host country to demonstrate WUF's role and commitment to continuous integrated knowledge exchange and incubation of scalable initiatives in the pursuit of sustainable urbanization. These legacy initiatives will be showcased in various WUF11 spaces, highlighting transformative impact and the link between WUF, UN-Habitat programmes and partners, especially in host cities.

WUF Alumni Network:

UN Habitat facilitated the formation of the WUF Alumni Network as a vehicle to support UN-Habitat in various endeavours relating to WUF, especially documentation of lessons learned. It was highlighted that that WUF has been an amazing journey of two decades in the making since Nairobi 2002. The WUF Alumni Network will convene for a working session to review the WUF's impact.

WUF11 Declared Actions & Action Plan for Cities:

The Action Plan for Cities initiative is designed to boost the implementation of the New Urban Agenda as an action-oriented framework to accelerate the localization of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in Poland. It aims to contribute to the Decade of Action and follows the recommendations set by the UN Secretary-General's report on Our Common Agenda, and the UN General Assembly resolution on the review of the implementation of the New Urban Agenda. It reflects the Polish local response to the

challenges of sustainable urbanization and local development in the context of recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic.

WUF11 Declared Actions will consist of voluntary actions and commitments made by participants to support implementation of the New Urban Agenda.

Urban Agenda Platform:

The Urban Agenda Platform is the global platform for sharing progress, action and knowledge on the implementation of the New Urban Agenda to achieve sustainable urban development. By systematizing and sharing advancements on the New Urban Agenda and urban-related SDGs, the platform aims to track progress and inspire and accelerate further action.

The Arab Urban Regional Data Platform - Vulnerability Assessment Profiling Workstream

11:00 - 12:00

UN Habitat's Regional Office of Arab States has been leading the development of the Regional Urban Data Platform (RUDP). An inclusive, sustainable platform that aims at supporting data harmonization, reliability and accessibility, it aims to become an interactive hub that helps develop a harmonized baseline for United Nations Country Teams (UNCTs) in the region,

in collaboration with local, national and regional partners.

Implementing the New Urban Agenda and SDGs at Local Level: Cases Mexico (San Nicolas de los Garza) and Brazil (Izidora)

12:30 - 13:30

This event brings together innovative initiatives developed during the pandemic that contributed to the localization and mainstreaming of global agendas within territorial public policy. These exercises have been particularly interesting for their efforts and innovative strategies to guarantee citizen participation within "2030 City Vision of San Nicolás de los Garza" that was awarded by UNDESA in 2021.

In Brazil, the Izidora's Region has four urban informal settlements – Esperança, Vitória, Helena Greco and Rosa Leão – covering approximately 1.5 km² and hosting about 5,000 precarious homes, with families in situations of extreme poverty and without public infrastructure and services. Izidora is an important environmental preservation area. The Municipality of Belo Horizonte (Minas Gerais State) worked with UN agencies to develop Izidora's Sustainable Urbanization Plan, according to the principles of the New Urban Agenda and SDG 11.



Transforming European Cities: for a Better Europe, for a Better World




11. Urban Cinema by Santander



His Excellency Dr Assem Al Gazzar Minister of Housing, Utilities, and Urban communities

Since 2001, the World Urban Forum has been the first and foremost global conference devoted to one of the most pressing issues facing the world: rapid urbanization and its impact on communities, cities, economies, climate change and policymaking. In 30 years from now, two-thirds of the world's population is likely to live in urban areas.

The Arab region is one of the fastest urbanizing regions in the world, expected to host 487 million people by 2030, of which 63% will live in cities and their margins.

As such, it is our honour to participate in WUF11 and to be hosting the Twelfth Session of the World Urban Forum (WUF12) in 2024 in one of the oldest and most culturally diverse cities of the world. Cairo.

Cairo has been typically portrayed as an old city experiencing the challenges of rapid urbanization, a precautionary tale for megacities in the Global South. On the other hand, over the past decade, Cairo has also witnessed an unprecedented wave of ambitious demand-driven public interventions, private, entrepreneurial and community-based solutions that speak to the vibrancy of the city's urban economy.

Consequently, Cairo is a unique setting for exploring the intersections of state-led projects with business and civil society-led initiatives, all guided by Egypt's Vision 2030, which is ultimately driven by the Sustainable Development Goals.

Capitalizing on Cairo's ties to cities in Africa, the Middle East and the Mediterranean, WUF12 aims to re-centre the urban issues of developing and emerging economies. Based on Egypt's geopolitical position at the nexus of those three regions and their common cultural assets and challenges, WUF12 will examine how urbanization and other societal, infrastructural, and environmental issues intersect at the centre of climate change mitigation and adaption efforts.

Most importantly, drawing on the lessons learned by cities and urban regions in the Global South, WUF12 aims to recast the urban resilience agenda beyond its current emphasis on preparedness for environmental risk towards greater inclusion of issues of social and spatial justice.

Six years prior to 2030, WUF12 will also be a milestone event taking stock of what has been achieved so far in the implementation of the New Urban Agenda and the Sustainable Development Goals at the global, regional, national, and local level. Moreover, four years after the COVID-19 pandemic, WUF12 will be a vantage point for an appraisal of the response and recovery efforts by all stakeholders from different countries, and an opportunity to prospect the way forward towards a more just, green and healthy future.

The World Urban Forum is a non-legislative technical forum convened by the United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-Habitat), hosted in a different city every two years, to examine the most pressing issues facing the world today in the area of human settlements, including rapid urbanization and its impact on cities, communities, economies, climate change and policies. It is the world's premier conference on cities.
