Banksy

The anonymous street graffiti artist



What is art? Over the years, people have given different answers. History has shown that art appears in many forms and styles, from cave paintings and realism to impressionism and abstract. For the street artist known as Banksy, art is a way to send a message by using satire and a dark sense of humor.

Banksy is a graffiti artist and political activist of unknown identity. His provocative artwork has been displayed on streets, walls, and bridges of cities throughout the world. After a series of art pieces painted on a wall in the West Bank, Banksy became internationally renowned. Although his identity remains unknown, it is believed by many that Banksy was born in Bristol, England possibly in 1974.

Over the years, many people have speculated the artist's true identity. In a *New York Times* article, Michiko Kakutani states that Banksy chooses to live an obscure life due to *"the illegal nature of graffiti"*. For *The Guardian*'s journalist Kakutani *"Banksy "maintains his anonymity as another tool in his arsenal...to get his own mystique bigger".*

Throughout his artistic career, Banksy has attracted attention from many, including artists and celebrities. Yet, there are those who believe his art is a form of vandalism. Some people feel his installations disrupt order and his artwork either destroys public property or causes controversy.

Anyway, Banksy appears to be aware of world events and social injustice. He creates intellectually stimulating works of art that provide his audience with a fresh look at those events and injustices. It is through his art that inspires people to take drastic action.
