

## 10 December, International Human Rights Day

**62% of Basque youths are satisfied with how human rights are upheld in the Basque Country, while 30% are dissatisfied.**

On occasion of the [International Human Rights Day](#), the [Basque Youth Observatory](#) is publishing some data on the satisfaction level of Basque youths regarding respect for human rights in the Basque Country.

12% of young people aged 15 to 29 are very satisfied and another 50% are quite satisfied. Therefore, we can state that 62% are satisfied with how human rights are upheld in the Basque Country.




On the other hand, 23% of Basque youths are not very satisfied and 7% are not at all satisfied. In other words, 30% of young people are dissatisfied at the level of respect for human rights in the Basque Country.

The remaining 7% do not contribute an opinion.

The level of satisfaction among young people regarding human rights in the Basque Country has increased significantly when compared to previous years: in 2005 it was 35%, in 2008 it was 45% and in 2014 (the latest data available) it was 62%.

This increase in the level of satisfaction is also found among people over 29 years of age.



However, in 2014, young people were slightly more satisfied than people over the age of 29.
